The Plant Care Guide

Everything your miniature scene needs to thrive —
in a few minutes a month.

THE GOLDEN RULES

Four rules that cover 90% of plant care.

1 **When in doubt, don't water.**

Nearly every houseplant death is drowning, not thirst. All our plants store water and forgive missed waterings — none of them forgive soggy soil.

2 **Bright, indirect light.**

A spot near a window, but out of harsh direct sun. Direct afternoon sun scorches leaves; deep shade slows growth. Near-a-window is the sweet spot.

3 **Feel the soil before watering.**

Push a finger one inch into the soil. Damp? Wait. Dry? Water slowly near the roots until just moist — never until it pools.

4 **Keep the moss alive with mist.**

The moss base loves a light spray every 2–3 days. Misting the moss is separate from watering the plant — moss drinks from its surface.

Your plant, specifically.

Money Plant (Pothos)

WATER WEEKLY

- Let the top inch of soil dry between waterings.
- Trails happily — trim long vines to keep the scene's shape.
- Wipe leaves with a damp cloth monthly to keep them glossy.

ZZ Plant

WATER EVERY 2–3 WEEKS

- Stores water in its roots — the most forgiving plant we use.
- Yellow leaves mean too much water, not too little.
- Happy even in lower light. Dry cloth only for the waxy leaves.

Snake Plant

WATER EVERY 3–4 WEEKS

- Let the soil dry out completely between waterings.
- Overwatering is the only real way to harm it.
- Tolerates almost any light — perfect for offices.

Aglaonema

KEEP LIGHTLY MOIST

- Likes soil slightly damp — never soggy, never bone dry.
- Loves warmth and gentle light; avoid cold draughts.
- Wipe leaves with a slightly damp cloth. No leaf-shine sprays.

Jade

WATER WHEN SOIL IS DRY

- A succulent — thrives on neglect and bright light.
- Plump leaves = happy. Wrinkled leaves = time to water.
- A symbol of prosperity; grows slowly and lives for decades.

PLANT SOS

If something looks wrong.

Yellow, soft leaves

Overwatering. Stop watering, move to brighter light, let the soil dry fully.

Brown, crispy tips

Underwatering or harsh direct sun. Water thoroughly; move out of afternoon sun.

Pale, stretched growth

Not enough light. Move closer to a window.

Moss turning brown

It's thirsty — mist daily for a week and it usually greens back up.

Figurines dusty

A soft dry brush or cloth. Never spray the decor pieces.
